



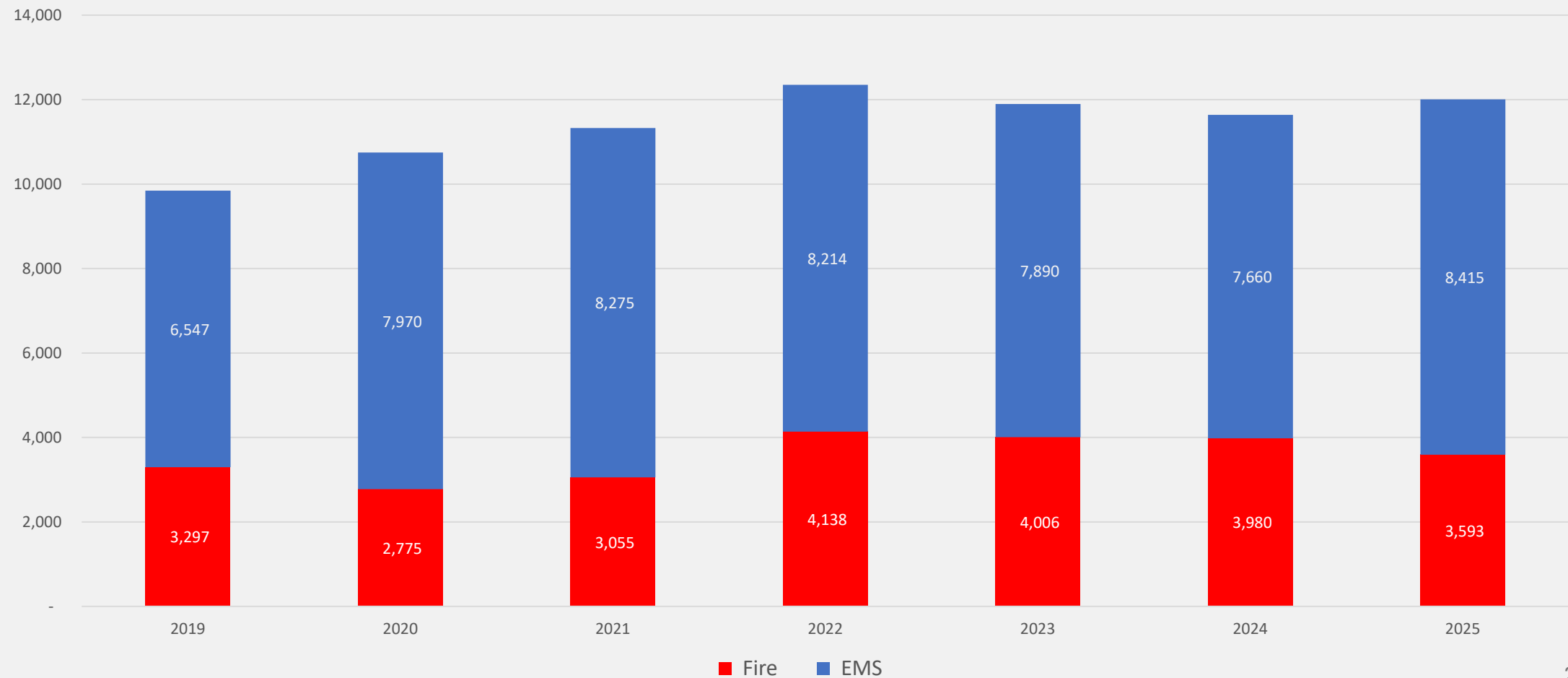

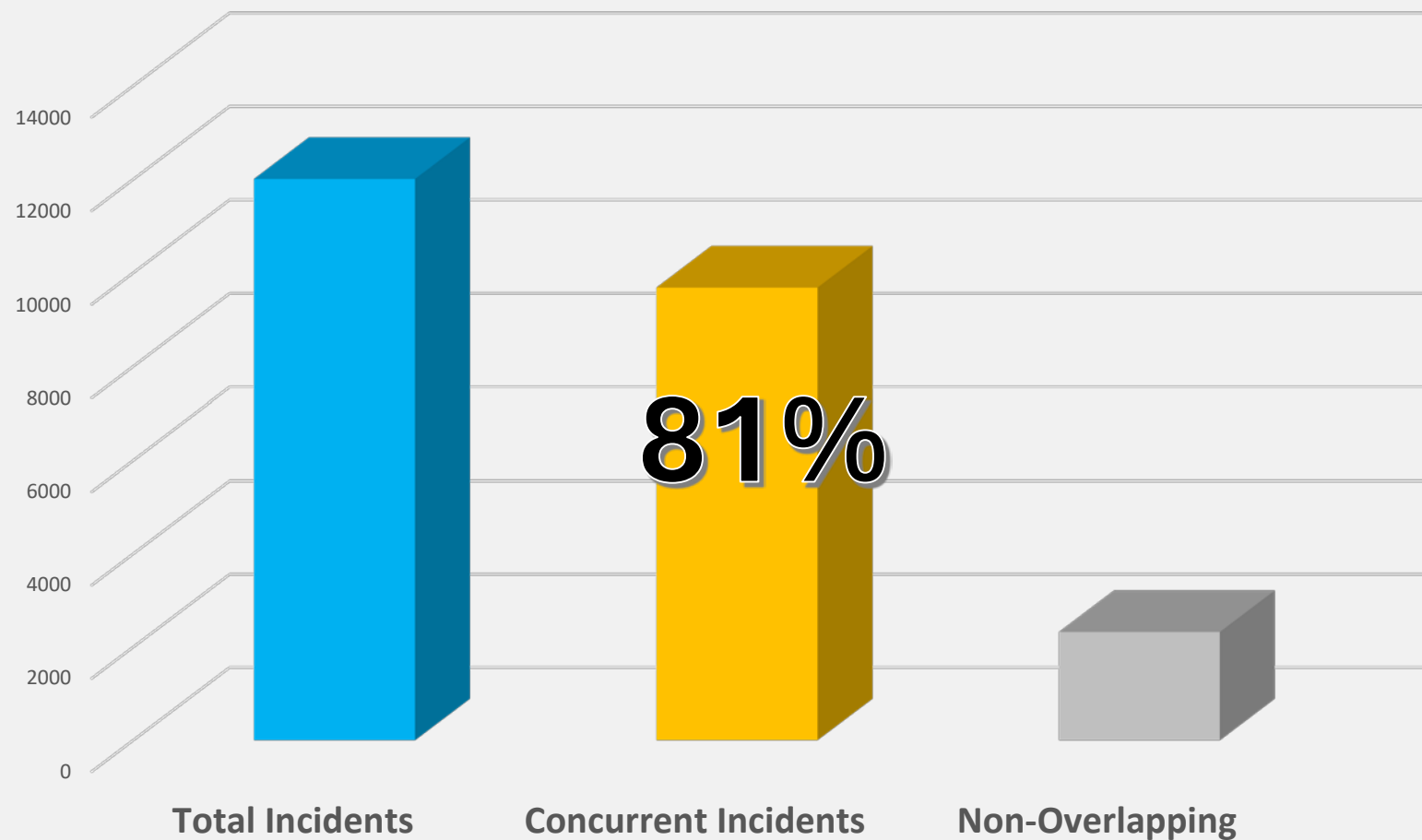

Call Volume Trends

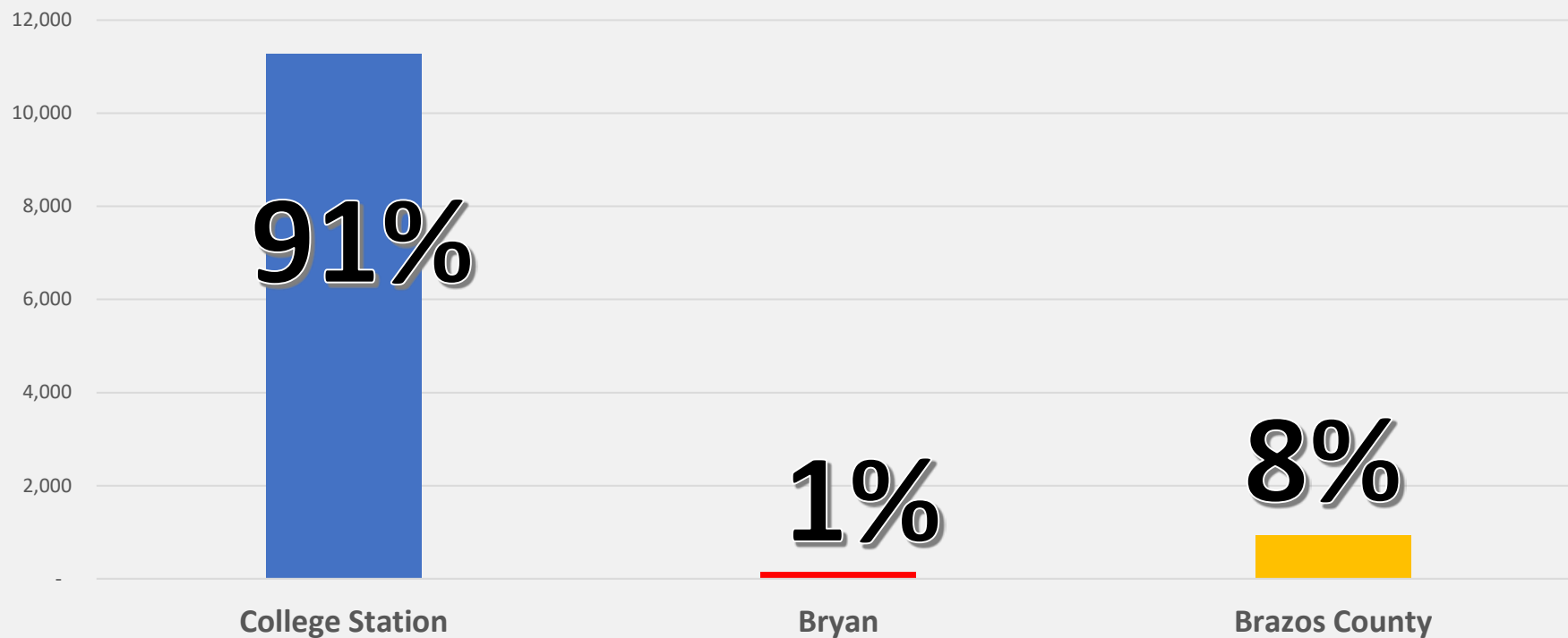


Concurrent Incidents



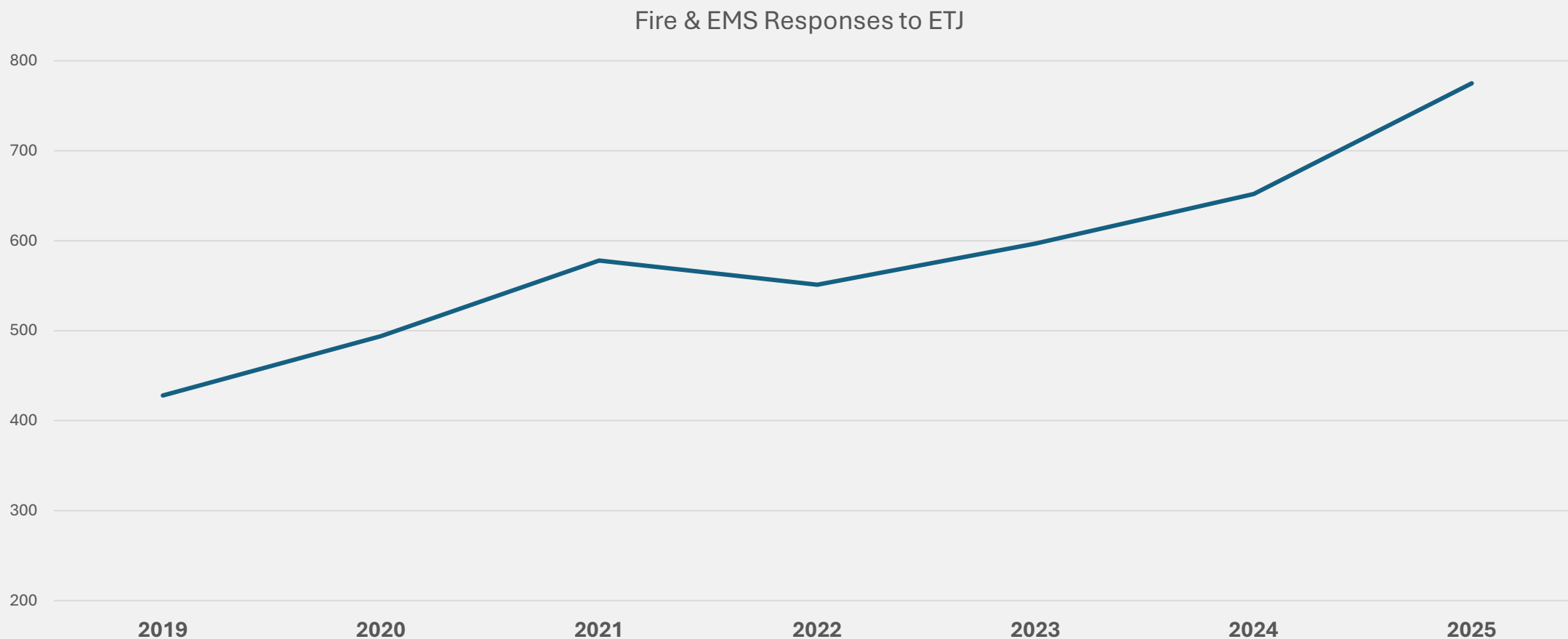

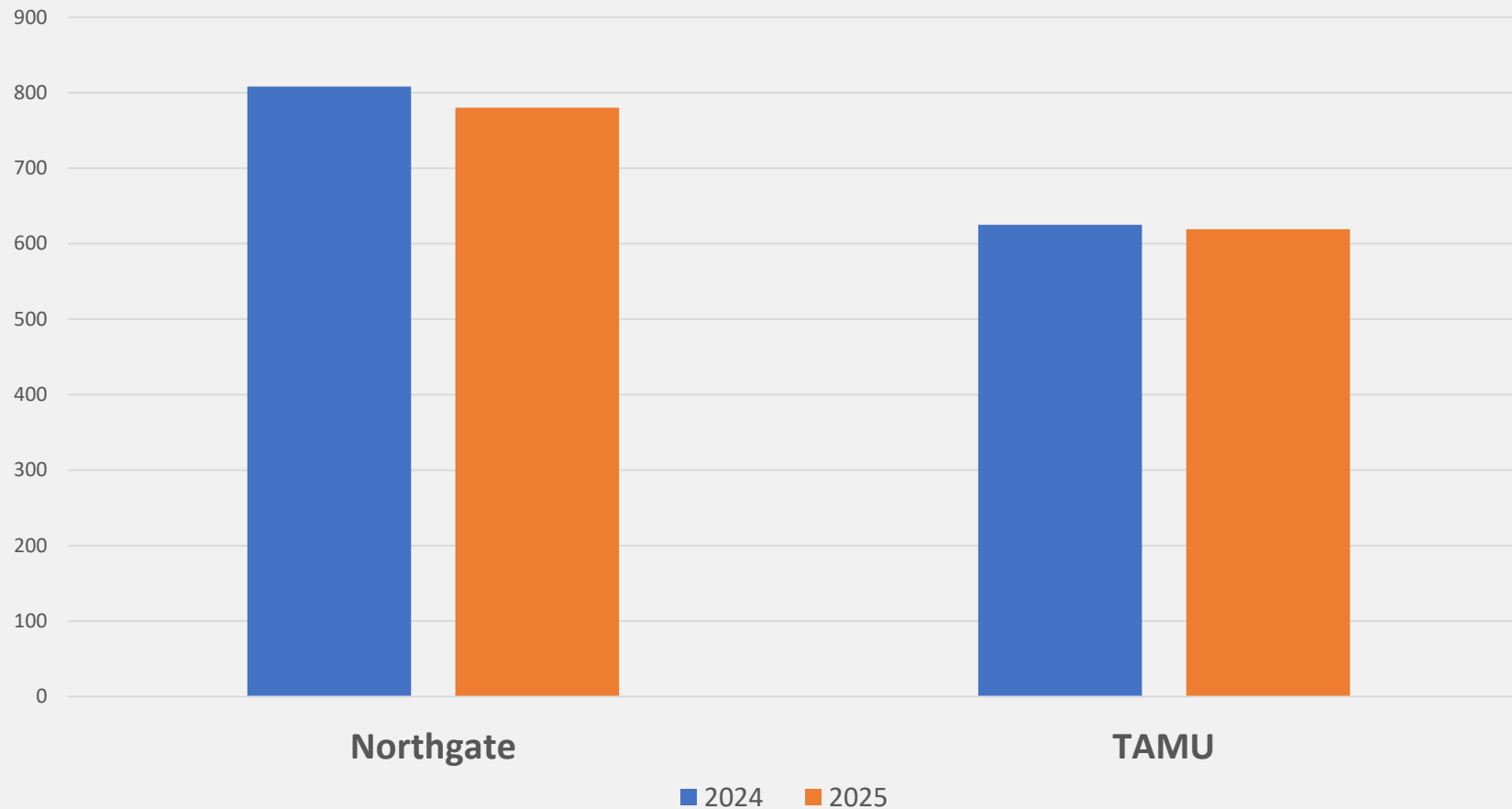




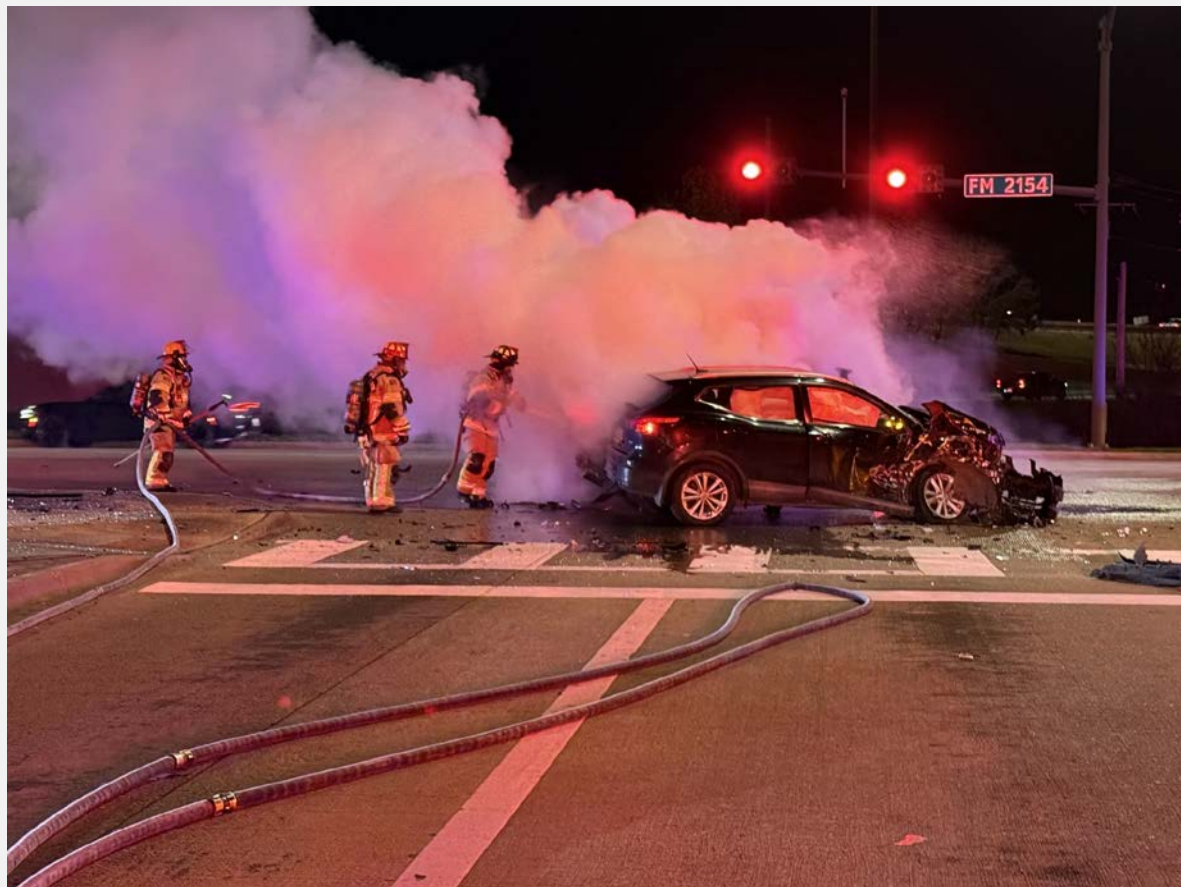
Fire & EMS Response Trend to ETJ



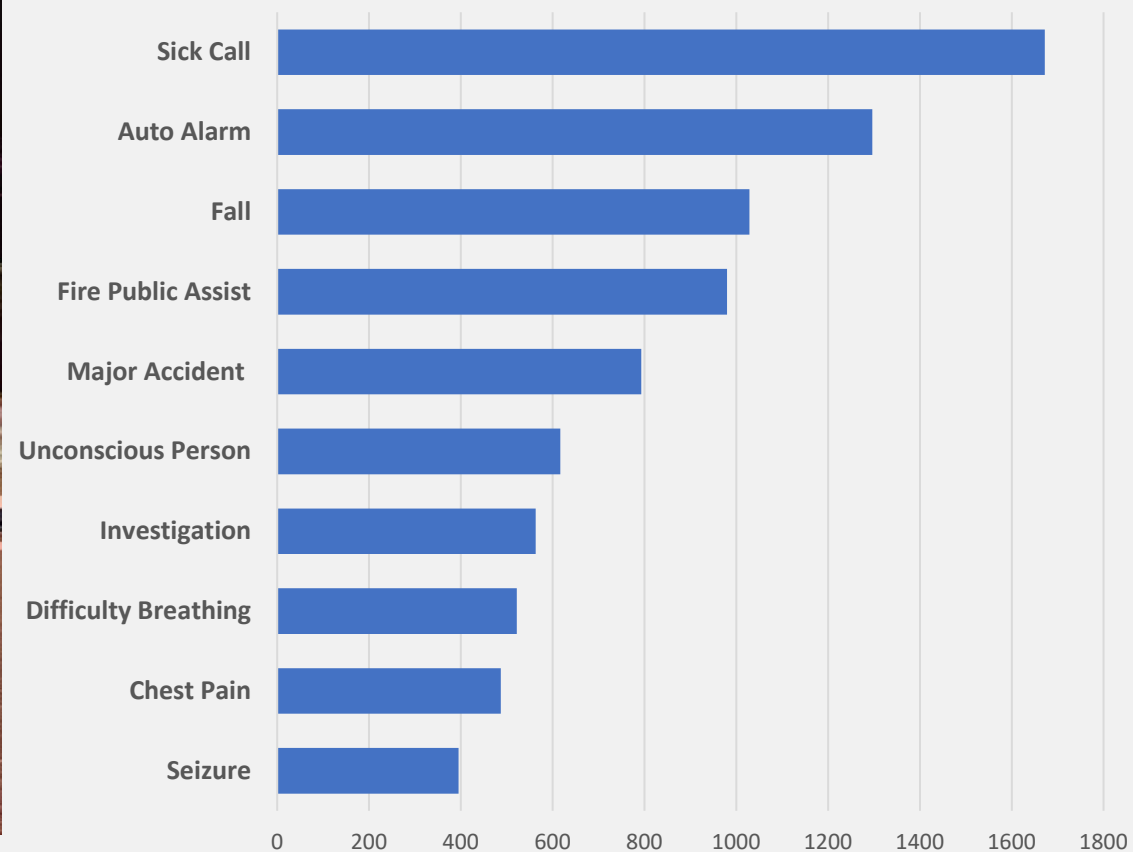

Most Common Call Types

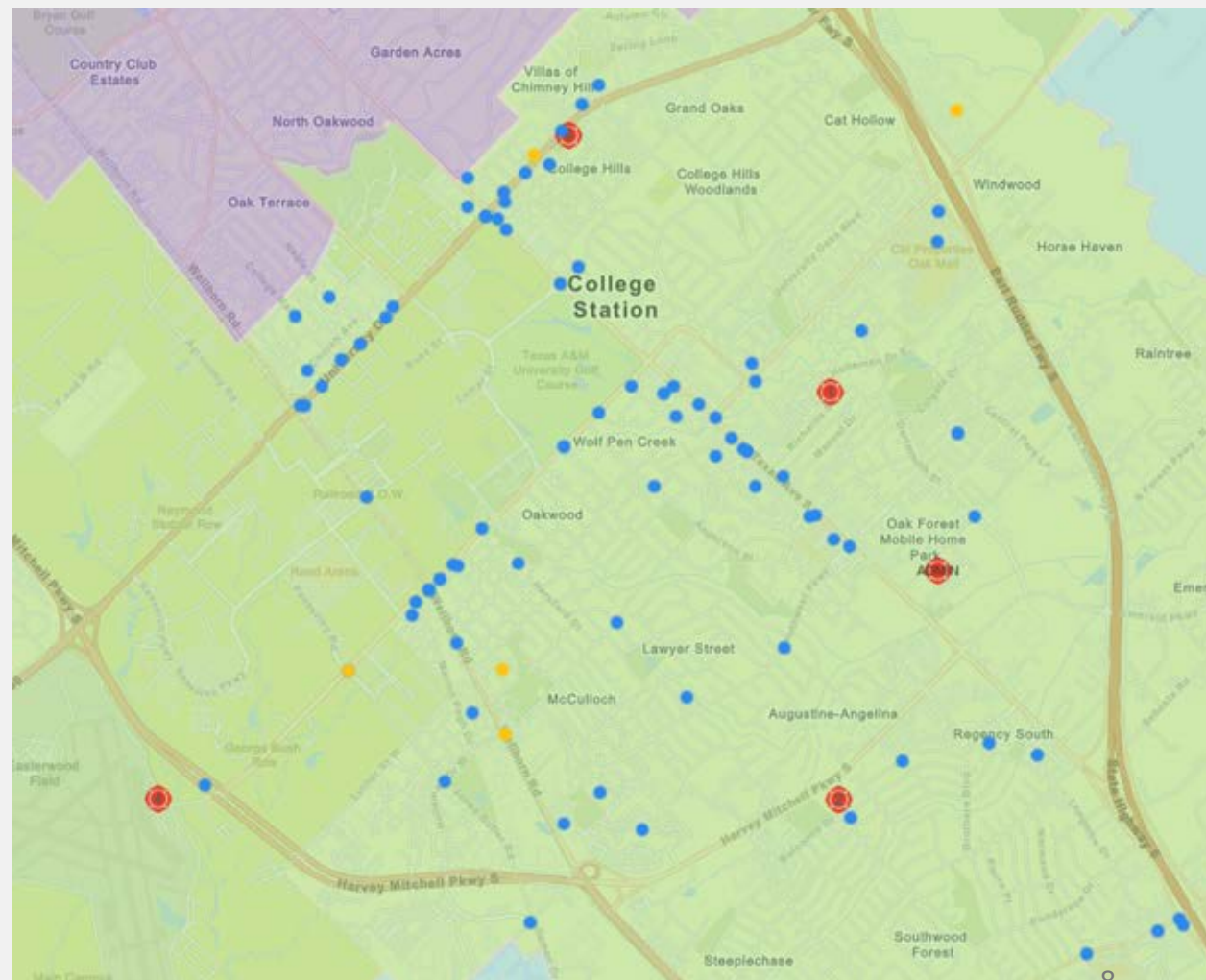
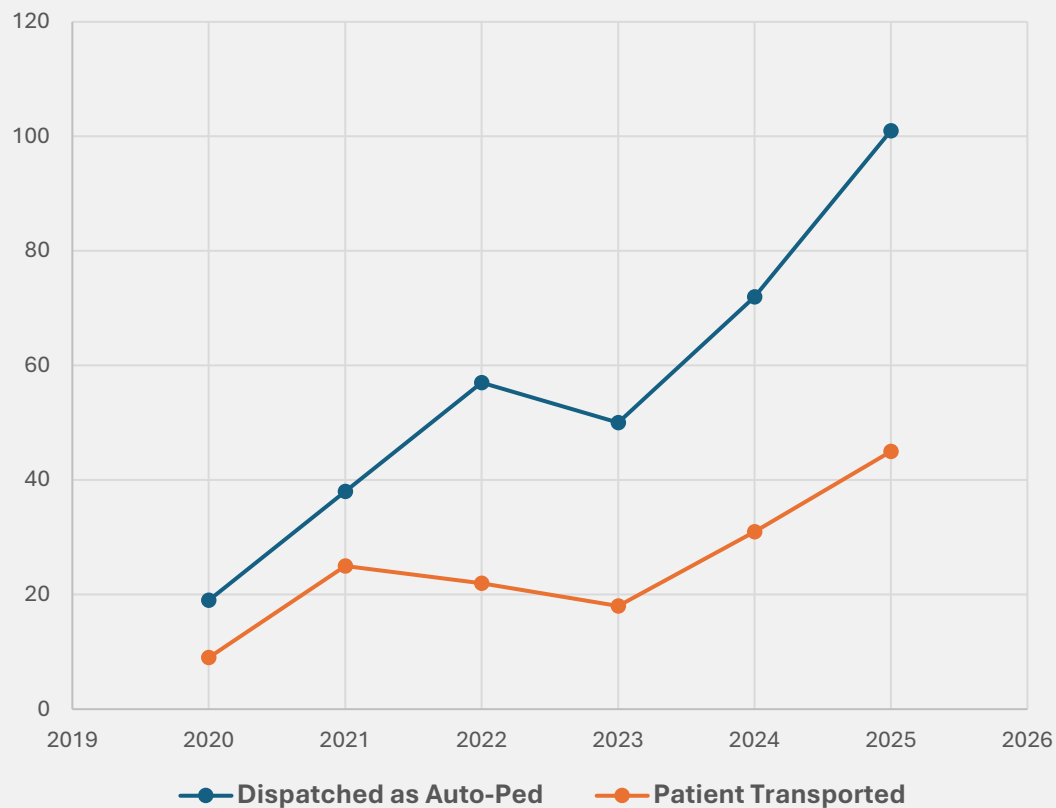


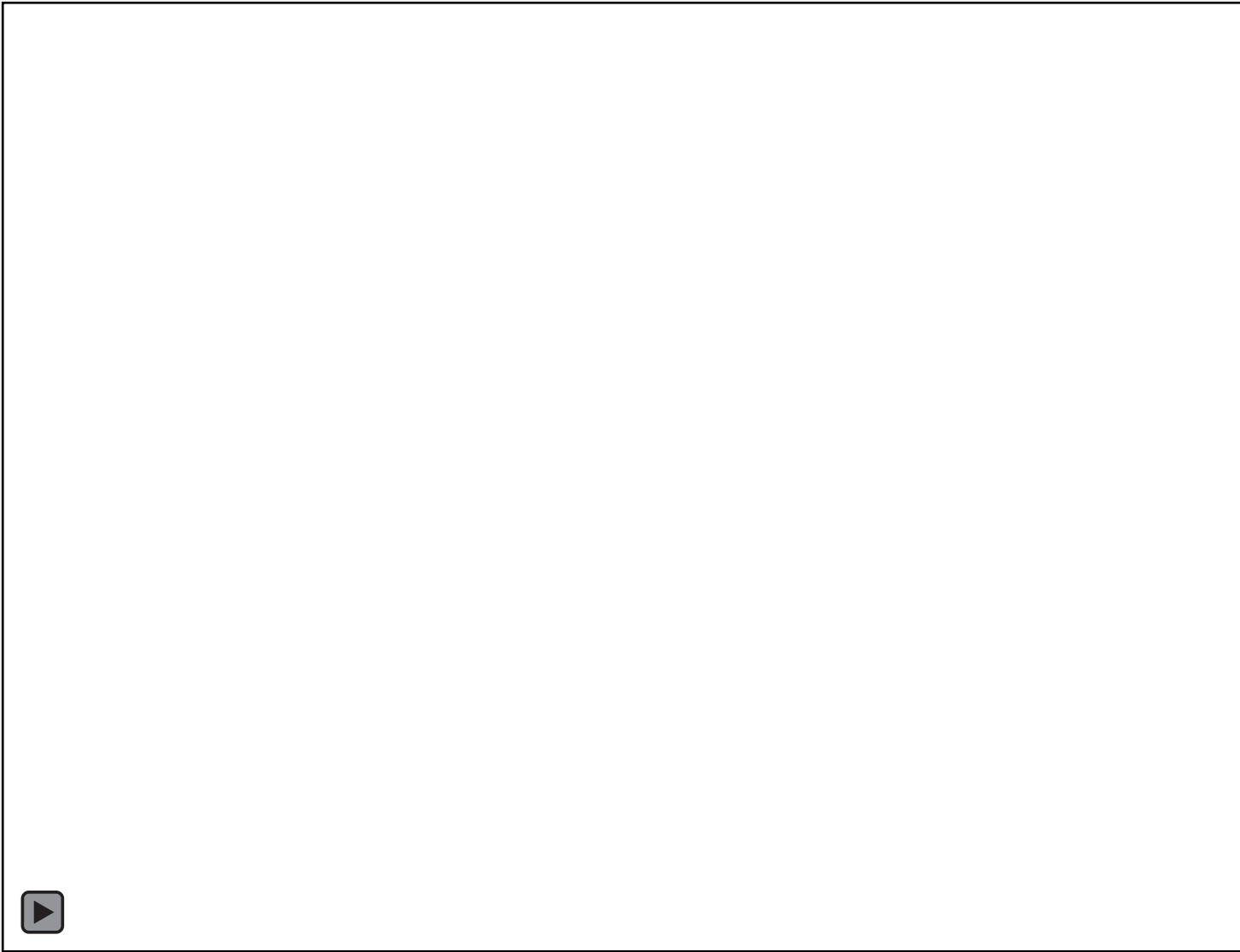
Top Ten Call Types 2025

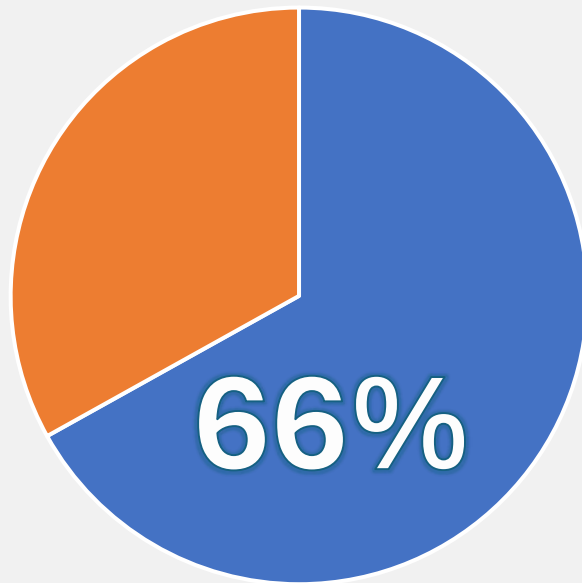

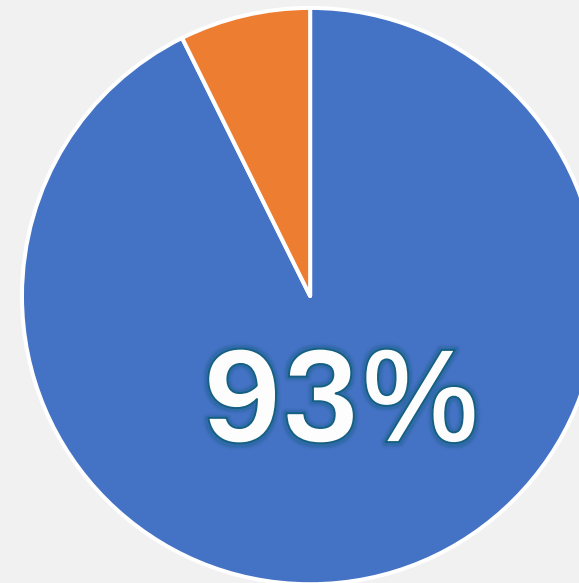
2025 Transport vs. No Transport

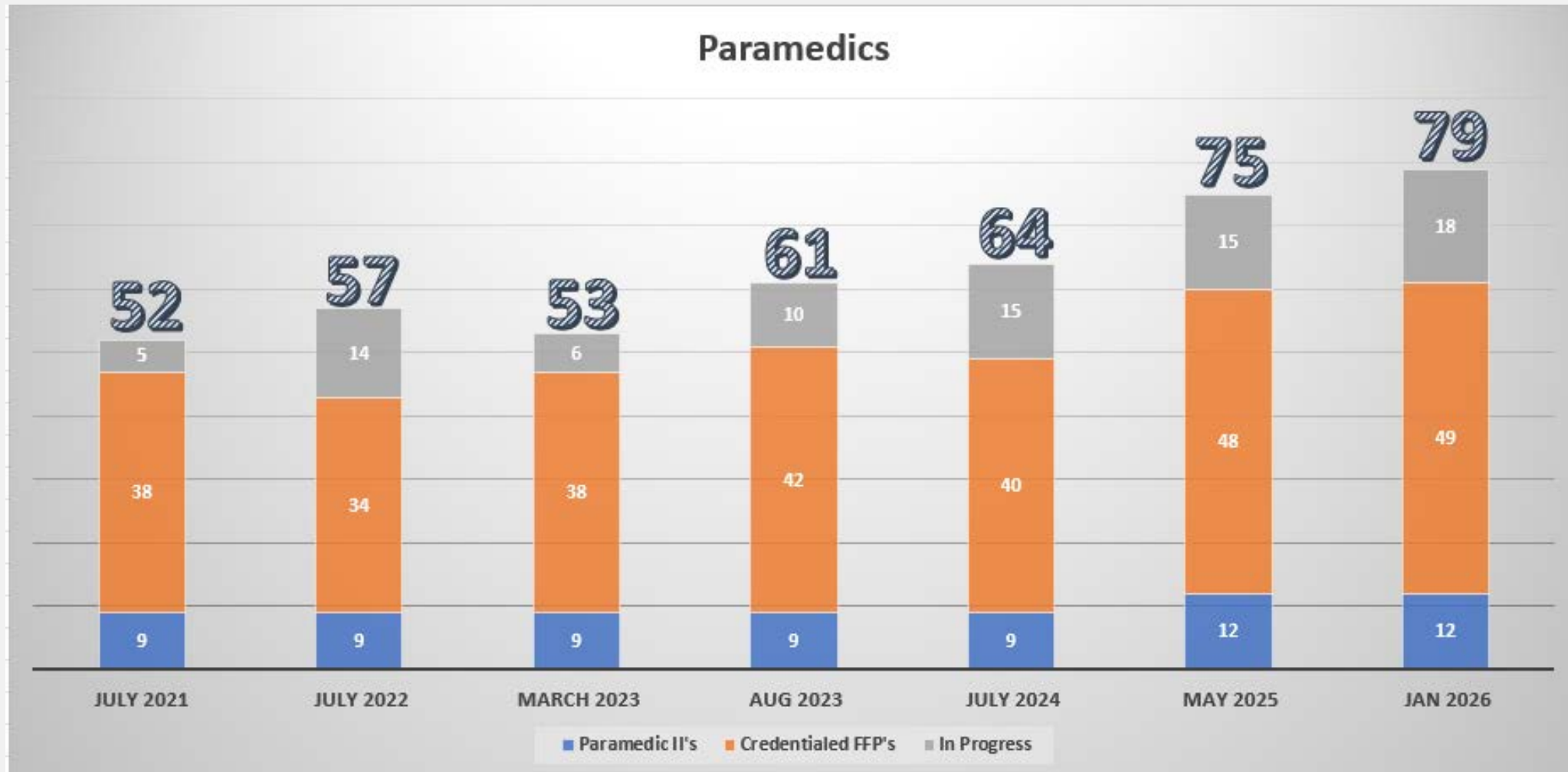
ALS vs BLS Care During Transport

2025 ALS Care w/ Transport vs. BLS Care w/ Transport

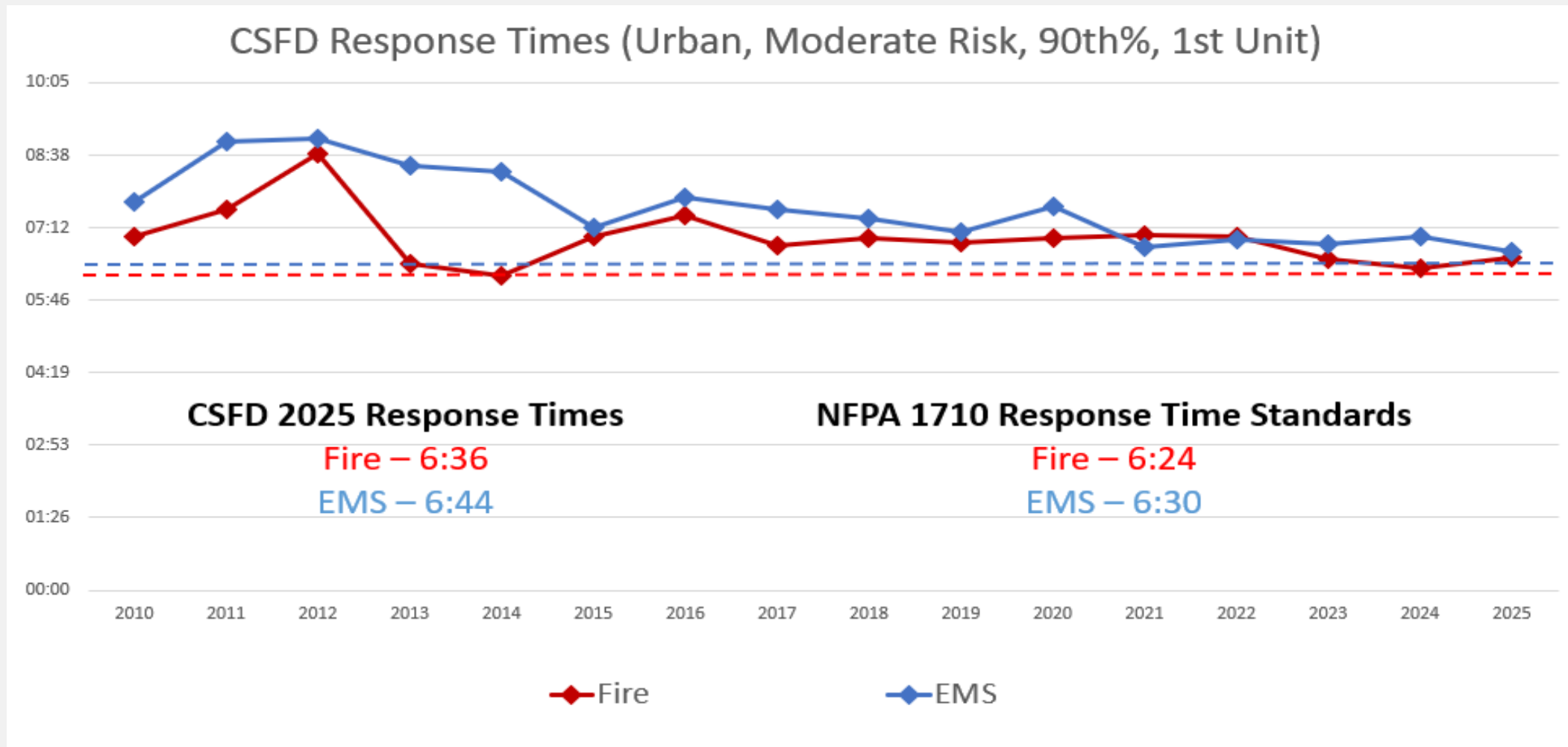

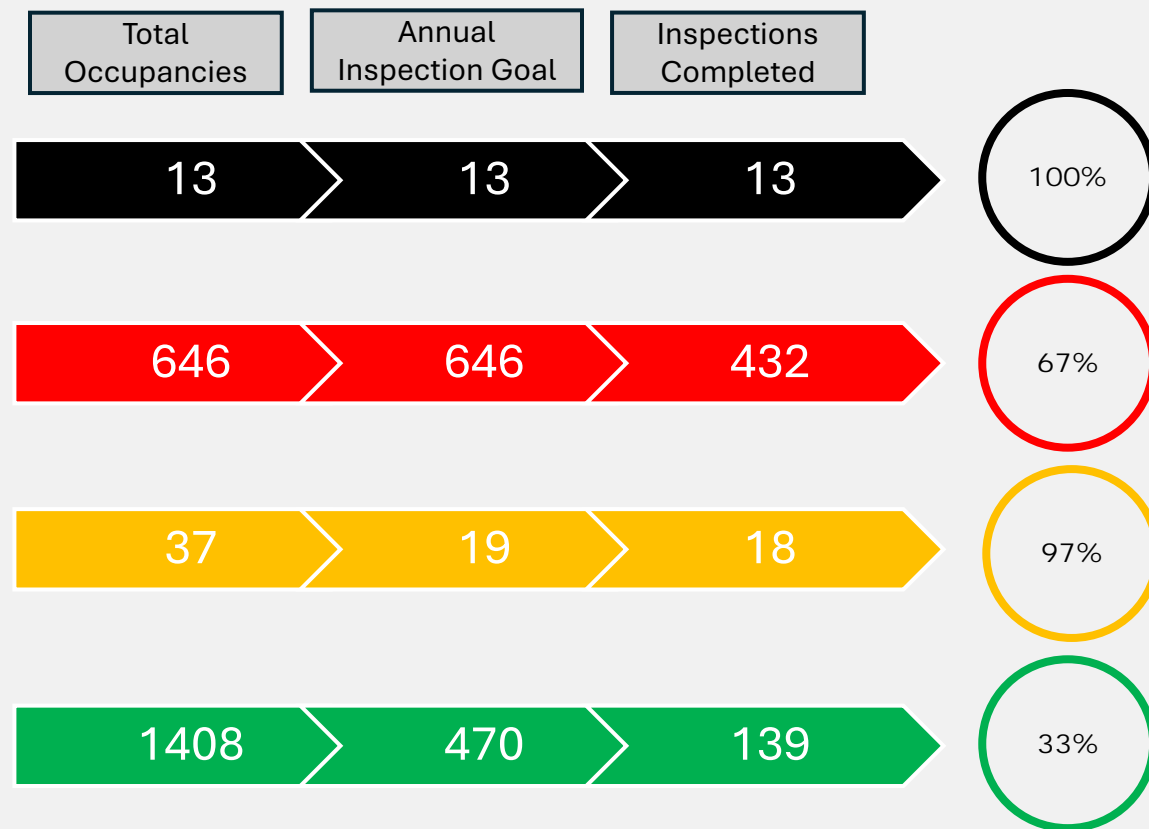


Response Time Trends



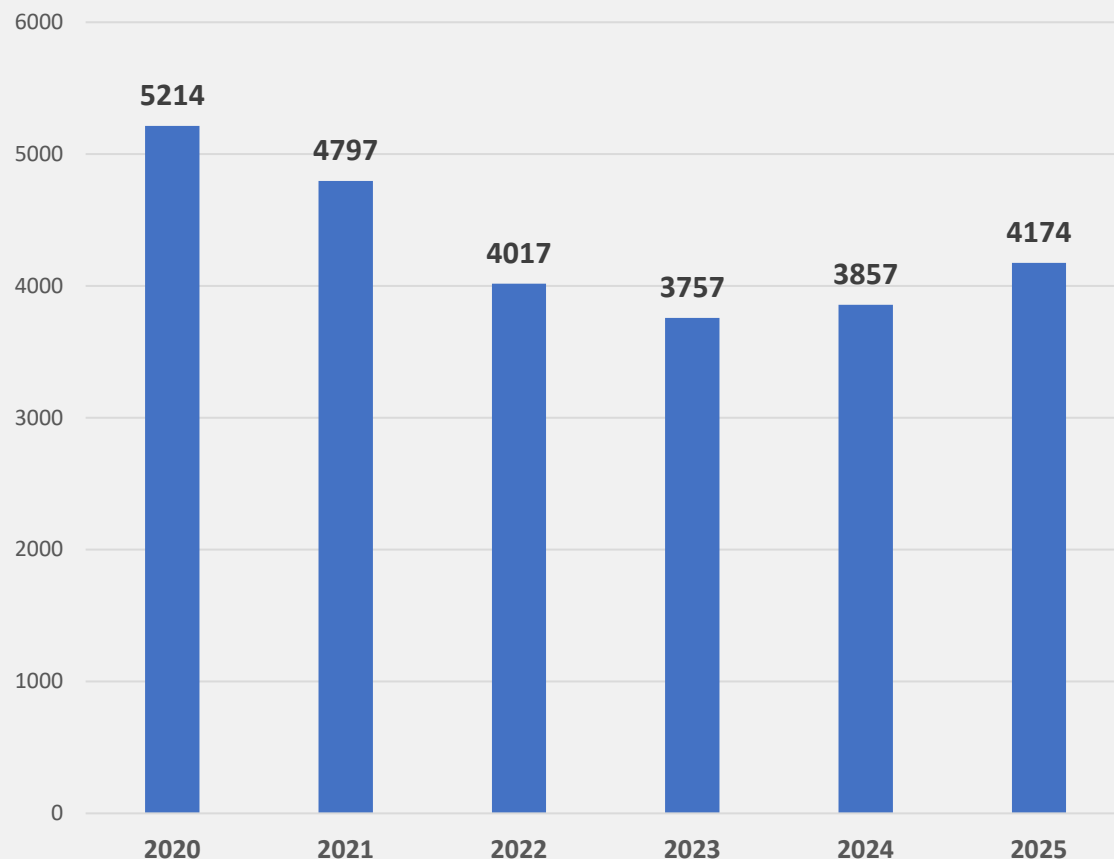
Fire Prevention Occupancy Inspections

- Critical Infrastructure** – annually - community critical systems & networks
-Water treatment, power facilities
- High-risk** – annually - high potential for life loss or significant economic impact
-Mult-family, high-rise, child care, big box mercantile, schools
- Moderate Risk** – biennial - moderate risk of life loss or economic impact
-Ambulatory health care, light industrial
- Low Risk** – Triennial - low risk of life loss or economic impact
-Business offices, Storage

48/96 Shift Schedule

- Alternative 56-hour workweek schedule
- Widespread growth among mid-size departments
- Implemented 11/4/24
- Decrease in overtime
- 11.8% decrease in accidents
- 48.5% increase in training
- 28.7% decrease in unscheduled absenteeism
- Improved morale
 - 93% approval by members
 - Increasing quality of life
 - Increasing work-life balance
 - Increasing physical health
 - Increasing mental health
 - Improved family relationships

Training

- Hired 47 members in past 3 years
 - Structured 2-year phase training program
- Trained all members in Active Attack Integrated Response (AAIR)
- Mass Casualty Training
- Advanced EMS Training
- 2026 – Emphasis on Highrise
 - Northgate District
 - 6 existing high-rises
 - 5 under construction
 - 2 in planning phase
 - 6,972 beds in NG
 - 14,000+ estimated by Fall 2027

Engines

- Received (1) in April 2024
- Received (2) in July 2025
- (3) on order
 - (1) in July 2026
 - (2) in spring 2029
- (3) Engines in reserve

Ladder

- (1) ordered, October 2028 delivery

Ambulances

- Received (4) in 2024
- (2) on order – Feb. 2027 delivery
- (3) reserves
- All front-line fleet replaced with 4x4
